SNAP is the largest program in the domestic hunger safety net, offering nutrition assistance to millions of eligible, low-income individuals and families and provides economic benefits to communities. The Food and Nutrition Service works with State agencies, nutrition educators, and neighborhood and faith-based organizations to ensure that those eligible for nutrition assistance can make informed decisions about applying for the program and access benefits.

**Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)**

WIC provides Federal grants to States for supplemental foods, health care referrals, and nutrition education for low-income pregnant, breastfeeding, and non-breastfeeding postpartum women, and to infants and children up to age five who are found to be at nutritional risk.

**How to Apply:** Call the local WIC office or call toll free to apply for WIC. The local WIC office will provide a date and time for a WIC certification visit. At this visit, the household income and the medical/nutrition status of each applicant will be reviewed.

**FEDERAL/STATE SCHOOL MEAL PROGRAMS**

**Direct Certification:** All school districts nationwide are required to directly certify children living in households that receive SNAP/Food Stamp benefits for free school meals. Direct certification is also possible through enrollment in certain Medicaid programs. States and school districts should also work with other agencies, such as the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR) and the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) office to certify without paper application other categorically eligible children. Children who are categorically eligible and may be directly certified include children in foster care, Head Start, homeless, migrant or living in households receiving SNAP/Food Stamp, certain Medicaid programs, FDPIR or TANF benefits may be directly certified.

## AFTER SCHOOL MEALS

### School Breakfast and Lunch Program

This program is a federally assisted meal program operating in public and nonprofit private schools and residential child care institutions. It provides nutritionally balanced, low-cost or free breakfasts and lunches to children each school day.

**How to Apply:** Schools send school meal applications home at the beginning of each school year. However, you may apply for school meals at any time throughout the school year by submitting a household application directly to your school. Your school will provide you with an application upon request. If you are earning at or below current income eligibility guidelines we encourage you to contact your school to fill out a school meal application. The school or local education agency will process your application and issue an eligibility determination. ### Farm to School Program

This program enriches the connection communities have with fresh, healthy food and local food producers by engaging food purchasing and education practices at schools and early care and education settings. The school system works with farmers and distributors to bring locally grown food into schools. Students gain access to healthy, local foods as well as education opportunities at school gardens, cooking lessons and farm field trips. Children and their families are empowered to make informed food choices.

### FFVP: Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program

FFVP is a federally assisted program providing free fresh fruits and vegetable to students in participating elementary schools during the school day. The program is an important tool in our efforts to combat childhood obesity, and has been successful in introducing students to a variety of produce that they otherwise might not have the opportunity to sample. FFVP is consistent with and supports the Institute of Medicine's recommendations to provide healthier snack choices in schools.

### Summer Food Service Program (in Florida, "BreakSpot")

The Summer BreakSpot program help to fill the nutrition gap by providing free meals to kids 18 and under all summer long. Supervised locations offer healthy breakfasts, lunches or snacks in a safe environment with no limitations to access. Locations open as schools let out for the summer.
